



VOLUNTARY ROLES – ENGLAND BOXING CHAMPIONSHIPS SUB-COMMITTEE

Introduction

England Boxing is the National Governing Body for the one of the oldest sports in the world, one which has featured in the ancient and modern Olympic Games since 1904.

With its own heritage going back to the 1880s, including the first national competition in 1881, the organisation is responsible for promoting and developing the sport at all levels, from grass roots through to the England talent pathway and, in turn, passing prospective medallists on to GB Boxing. The organisation is a member of AIBA and EUBC, the World and European governing bodies respectively.

Clearly stated ambitions in England Boxing's new strategy include the provision of enhanced support to the membership, in particular the *unlocking of potential* and as a result the delivery of appropriate competitions and events from entry through to elite levels for all of England Boxings membership.

The national competitions and specifically the finals need to reflect their proud heritage, be safely, successfully and efficiently delivered, be commercially viable and reflect they are producing the Champion boxers of England.

In order to achieve this, England Boxing is seeking to recruit volunteers to the Championships Sub-committee who have the appropriate skills, knowledge and experience combined with ambitions to support and drive the delivery of our national championships, associated competitions and events.

The sub-committee, which meets a minimum of four times per year, is chaired by an England Boxing Director and reports directly into the England Boxing Board.

It is expected that the successful individuals will have an in-depth knowledge of at least one aspect of competition and event delivery and applicants from both the England Boxing membership and the wider community are encouraged to apply.

Sub-committee remit includes

- To support, promote and develop the organisation's national and associated championships in order to ensure that the competitions and their delivery are of a high standard, are fit for purpose and encourage more entries into championships from Regions, Divisions, Clubs, Schools, Colleges and Universities.
- To monitor and assist in the design and implementation of a programme of competitions and events that are in line with the organisation's strategy and ambition, recognise the proud history of these competitions and in turn showcases the best the sport has to offer.
- To provide input into the delivery of the championships with specific emphasis on ensuring there is an appropriate competition pathway at all levels and to ensure that the events are conducted within safe and regulated environments.
- To provide appropriate input into ensuring that the competitions and events operate in such a way that they are commercially attractive, well attended, branded, marketed and presented to a high standard and to a level commensurate with other national championships and similar events.
- The sub-committee will work alongside the Technical and Rules Sub-committee and other sub-committees to develop and maintain a robust set of rules to govern National Championships for all categories of boxing in England. This is to include setting of dates and competition draws and progression structures.
- Advise on the delivery of other competitions and development opportunities and events that fall within the organisations sphere and that support the overall strategic aims of the organisation.
- Ensure the sub-committee is aware of emerging issues and opportunities surrounding competition and event delivery, specifically how they can relate to the delivery of amateur boxing competitions.

Sub-committee members are in place for a maximum of two terms, (a term constitutes four years), but shorter terms of commitment may be considered.

Person Specification

The sub-committee currently has an abundance of boxing specialists. However, to support the committee to achieve the vision of the England Boxing strategy, the Chair is looking for three applicants who have specific experience in the following:

- The organisation and delivery of National / International events which can be sport-related but not exclusively limited to the sporting arena. A wider understanding of promotion, branding and event presentation is essential.
- Experience in commercial and sponsorship activity associated with national / international events and or competitions, including marketing.
- Excellent administration skills in MS Office and specifically MS Excel. Experience in producing meeting minutes and meeting co-ordination responsibilities.

These are voluntary, unpaid positions, but reasonable out-of-pocket expenses will be reimbursed for travel to meetings, etc.
