



ENGLAND BOXING NATIONAL JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS 2021 – KEY INFORMATION CIRCULAR

1) General Information

Welcome to the key information circular for the England Boxing National Junior 2021 Championships, to be held in Nottingham at the Harvey Hadden Sports Village, Wigman Road, Nottingham NG8 4PB on Saturday 16th and Sunday 17th October.

This circular will address operational and logistical matters relating to the event and hopefully answer any queries you have at this stage.

This event is for male and female Juniors and Junior Cadets, as well as male and female Class A and B Junior Development boxers.

The semi-finals will be on Saturday 16th and the finals will be on Sunday 17th. These final stages of the event are staged by England Boxing, but we would like to recognise the extensive work put in by all those involved in the regional rounds in the run-up to this weekend, and thank them for their efforts.

2) Timings

Saturday 16th October

Boxing commences: 1pm. A 30-minute break will then take place in Rings A and B from 3.30pm until 4pm and then in Rings C and D from 4pm until 4.30pm.

Sunday 17th September

Boxing commences: 12noon. A 30-minute break will then take place in Rings A and B from 3pm until 3.30pm and then in Rings C and D from 3.30pm until 4pm.

3) COVID-19 rules and guidance

All event attendees, including boxers, coaches, England Boxing staff, volunteers, all other personnel and spectators must follow an agreed procedure as a condition of entry for the benefit of the health and safety of everyone.

If you have recently tested positive for Covid-19 and are not out of your isolation period, have been asked to self-isolate by government Test and Trace because of Covid-19 or are showing symptoms of Covid-19, do not attend the venue.

Everyone entering the building may have their temperature tested. Those with a high temperature or who are displaying obvious Covid-19 symptoms will be asked to take a lateral flow test by medics and will not be permitted to enter unless they do. They will be asked to wait outside or in their car for the results.

If a test comes back negative, that person can enter the building. If it comes back positive, they will be asked to leave the premises immediately and not permitted entry.

Once in the building, the venue's request is that everyone must wear a mask (unless medically exempt) while they are moving around. Please carry your exemption card with you.

Masks can be removed while seated in the arena seating area. This includes coaches, except once they are in the field of play when accompanying a boxer (but they must wear a mask on the way to ringside).

Please bring your own masks. Disposable mask will be available to purchase for £1 on the day.

4) Accreditation

Accreditation wrist bands will be issued to boxers and coaches at their weigh-in. Thereafter, a daily wristband will be issued for boxers and coaches competing that day at their weigh-in.

You will need to be in possession of your wrist band to access the field of play. Coaches must present and wear their current England Boxing lanyard at all times. No more than three coaches per boxer will be permitted into the venue (maximum of six coaches per club). No more than two coaches will be permitted ringside to corner the bout due to restrictions on numbers due to Covid-19.

5) Venue Access

Due to Covid-19, when not competing and having not yet taken part in their bout, boxers and coaches will only be allowed to watch the boxing via the sterile area, away from spectators.

Once their bout is complete, they can then exchange their wristband for a spectator wristband to join family in the stands, but will then not be permitted re-entry to the boxers' zones. Only bouts in-play, or when called by the whip, will be allowed onto the field of play. There will be no access at any other time.

6) Weigh-in

The weigh-ins will take place at the Harvey Hadden Sports Village for all weight categories. Timings are as below:

Saturday 16th October

10am to 12noon.

Sunday 17th October 2021

9am to 11am.

Boxers and coaches should be at the venue in good time to be weighed in and to carry out their medicals. The scales will close at 12noon on 16th October and 11am on 17th October.

Please ensure you bring your medical cards and gumshields with you (no red or partially red). Please note that due to the number of boxers entered in the event, **only one coach** from any one club will be allowed to enter the weigh-in room with their boxer(s).

Coaches are to make sure that their England Boxing lanyards are in-date and they bring them to the event. Only coaches of the same gender can enter the weigh-in room with their boxer.

Please also note that boxers only need to weigh-in on the day they are boxing.

Please be advised that any boxer who does not weigh-in and medical on the day they are required to do so will be withdrawn from the Championships.

7) Programme

The official draw will be released on Wednesday 13th October on the England Boxing website and advertised as such on social media.

There will be four boxing rings in place on both days.

Please note that the programme will be dependent on all boxers making the weight and passing the doctor's examination.

The confirmed bout order for each day will be promulgated on completion of the draw for the semi-finals and, following those results, for the finals.

8) Box Office

Tickets can be purchased at the Ticket Desk at the Harvey Hadden Sports Village. Prices are £20 per adult, £10 per concession (over 65) and £5 per child aged six to 15, with Under-5s are free. Please note it is cash only and there is not an ATM at the venue.

Once in the arena, spectators are reminded that they must remain seated at all times and not stand up against the ring barriers. This is particularly important given the current need for Covid-19 protocols (see section 3, above).

Should spectators stand, boxing will be stopped and will not continue until everyone is sat down. Please adhere to this instruction, not just out of respect for others, but also for everyone's health and safety.

Please note that England Boxing photographers and videographer will be capturing footage on both days of the event that may include capturing images of spectators. By attending as a spectator, you agree this imagery can be used by England Boxing and other media outlets.

9) Parking

Parking at the venue is free of charge and there is a large car park available to be used by visitors.

Please use the postcode **NG8 4PB** in your sat-nav for directions to the Sports Village.

10) England Talent

Please note that the 2021 England Boxing National Championships will not provide a route onto the England Talent Pathway Programme. Pathway recruitment is expected to resume at the 2022 England Boxing National Championships.

11) Live streaming

If you can't attend on the day to take in the action, then you can watch things unfold via online streaming on the England Boxing YouTube Channel, with further details to be announced in the lead-up to the event.
