Easy Read – Document Summary

Who does the Safeguarding Policy apply to?

The Policy can be used with **any member** of England Boxing. It is used to set a standard for the protection of **children and young people** who are England Boxing members. Safeguarding applies to everyone who is involved with England Boxing and everyone has a responsibility to look after children and young people.

How is the Safeguarding Policy used?

To report a safeguarding concern please read Section 4 of the Policy.

The Policy is used to explain what England Boxing does and our members need to do to keep everyone safe. When someone has a concern about safeguarding, **the policy explains how to report it and who to report it to**. Concerns can be reported to any adult at a club, a Club Welfare Officer, Regional Welfare Officer, or to England Boxing.

What is a safeguarding concern?

Sadly, some children and young people are abused by adults or other children. This can happen in lots of ways. The four main types of abuse are **physical abuse, sexual abuse, emotional abuse and neglect**. Therefore, keeping members safe is very important.

Why is this summary separate from the Safeguarding Policy?
