

# Moves Different – Referral and Eligibility Privacy Notice

## What is this notice about?

Moves Different is a programme delivered by us, England Boxing and Welsh Boxing. It is funded by the Youth Endowment Fund.

The programme aims to support young people's wellbeing through fully funded boxing sessions or vouchers for gym memberships. It also helps researchers understand whether these activities improve wellbeing and reduce involvement in crime or violence.

Before a young person joins the programme or research project, England Boxing or Welsh Boxing need to collect information to:

- understand whether the programme is suitable for them
- help keep young people safe,
- and decide if they can move to the next stage, where they receive boxing sessions or receive gym memberships

This notice explains how we collect and use personal information during this initial stage of the programme ("referral stage").

If a young person is found eligible and wishes to participate, they will later receive:

- additional project information,
- and a consent form for participating in the research project.
- a separate privacy notice about the research project

"Personal data" means information about a person that can identify them, such as their name, address, date of birth, or other personal details.

## Who is responsible for this information?

England Boxing Limited and Welsh Boxing are responsible for handling personal information collected during the referral stage.

## 2. What information do we collect?

As part of the referral stage, we may collect information including:

### Personal and contact information

- Name
- Date of birth
- Address
- Phone number
- Gender
- Ethnicity
- School information, such as the name of your school, school attendance, and Free School Meal eligibility

### Information about support needs and wellbeing

- Special educational needs or disabilities
- Mental health or wellbeing concerns
- Additional support needs (e.g. Looked After Child status, if young people are in care)
- Information relevant to participation in physical activity

### Information relevant to eligibility and safety

- School exclusion history
- Involvement in antisocial behaviour or violence
- Exposure to exploitation or abuse
- Association with criminal peer groups
- Substance misuse concerns
- Risk information relevant to safe participation
- Information about active conflicts or rivalries with other participants

We also collect parent's or carer's full name and contact details (phone number and email address) for young people under the age of 16 where required for consent and communication.

This information is usually provided:

- by young people themselves,
- by parents/carers,
- or by professionals supporting them, such as youth workers, schools, social workers, police, or youth offending teams.

## 3. Why do we collect this information?

We use this information to:

- assess whether a young person is eligible for Moves Different,
- decide whether participation is appropriate and safe,

- understand what support or adjustments may be needed,
- contact young people or parents/carers about the referral,
- and help administer the programme safely and fairly.

If this information is not provided, we may be unable to assess eligibility or progress a referral

We may also share relevant referral information with other research organisations supporting the programme including:

- the Ending Youth Violence Lab,
- the Centre for Evidence and Implementation,
- and ClearView Research.

This is necessary so the research project can understand whether the programme is effective at helping young people.

## 4. What is our lawful basis for using this information?

We use personal information because we have a legitimate interest in:

- delivering the Moves Different programme,
- assessing eligibility,
- keeping participants safe,
- and supporting research into youth violence prevention and wellbeing.

Some information collected during referrals may be more sensitive, including information about ethnicity, health, safeguarding concerns, or criminal exploitation risks.

Data protection law allows us to use this information because it is necessary for reasons of substantial public interest,

We will only use this information where it is necessary and proportionate.

## 5. Who will see this information?

Referral information will only be accessed by people who need it for the purposes of the programme or research project.

This may include:

- England Boxing staff,
- Welsh Boxing staff,
- approved local boxing clubs where relevant,
- the Ending Youth Violence Lab,
- the Centre for Evidence and Implementation,
- and ClearView Research.

We do not sell personal information to anyone.

We may also share information where necessary for safeguarding reasons, including where there are concerns about serious harm or criminal activity.

## **6. How long will we keep this information?**

If a young person does not progress into the research project, referral information will only be kept for as long as reasonably necessary for programme administration, safeguarding, audit, or legal purposes.

If a young person progresses into the research project, additional information about retention periods will be explained in the separate research privacy notice provided at that stage.

## **7. What are your rights?**

Under data protection law, individuals have rights including the right to:

- ask for a copy of their information,
- ask for incorrect information to be corrected,
- ask for information to be deleted in some circumstances,
- object to certain uses of their information,
- or ask us to restrict how information is used.

Because some information is used for research purposes, these rights may sometimes be limited under data protection law.
